In Quarterly 10, the team has been performing the following tasks:

- Second round of the coding process with NVivo software. All the data from the different countries have been integrated in the corresponding NVivo Server project. All research teams have finished the second node tree. The purpose of this second coding was the extraction of all the transmedia skills and informal learning strategies of each country. The Coordination Team, with suggestions of the rest of the partners, merged every partner list and created a Global Transmedia Skills and Informal Learning Strategies list. The Deliverable D4.2. is a complete report of the Global Transmedia Skills and Informal Learning Strategies list. This document is available at the project website.
- Data systematisation & analysis: The Coordination Team has begun the task of comparing the NVivo nodes of each partner in order to create a global list of transmedia skills and informal learning strategies. At the moment, there is a European Transmedia Skills and Informal Learning Strategies node tree which includes the data from Spain, United Kingdom, Portugal, Italy and Finland.
- The **project contract amendment (Document Number: 645238-13)** suggested by the Transliteracy Research Team on July 7th was approved by the project officer on August 25th. The proposal was to move Deliverable D.4.2. from June to September and D5.3., D5.4, D5.5, D5.6, D5.7, D5.8, D5.9, D5.13, D5.14, D5.15, D5.16, D5.17 and D5.18 from September to November 2017.
- Social media and website dissemination: We are spreading new contents and all the call for papers related to Transliteracy Project both at the <u>project website</u> and the Twitter account <u>@Trans_Literacy</u>.
- The Transliteracy team is working on the project final conference that will be hosted by Pompeu Fabra University from 22-24 March 2018. At the moment, there are six keynote speakers confirmed: Dr. David Buckingham (University of Loughborough, UK), Dr. Divina Frau-Meigs (Université Sorbonne Nouvelle, France), Dr. Julian Sefton-Green (Deakin University, UK Australia), Dr. Heather Horst (University of Sidney, Australia), Dr. Alejandro Piscitelli (Universidad de Buenos Aires, Argentina) and Dr. Sonia Livingstone (London School of Economics, United Kingdom). The aim of this conference is to share different experiences and knowledge between the Media Literacy scholars and Primary and Secondary School teachers. For that reason, there were several sessions of academic papers, workshops, round tables, etc.
