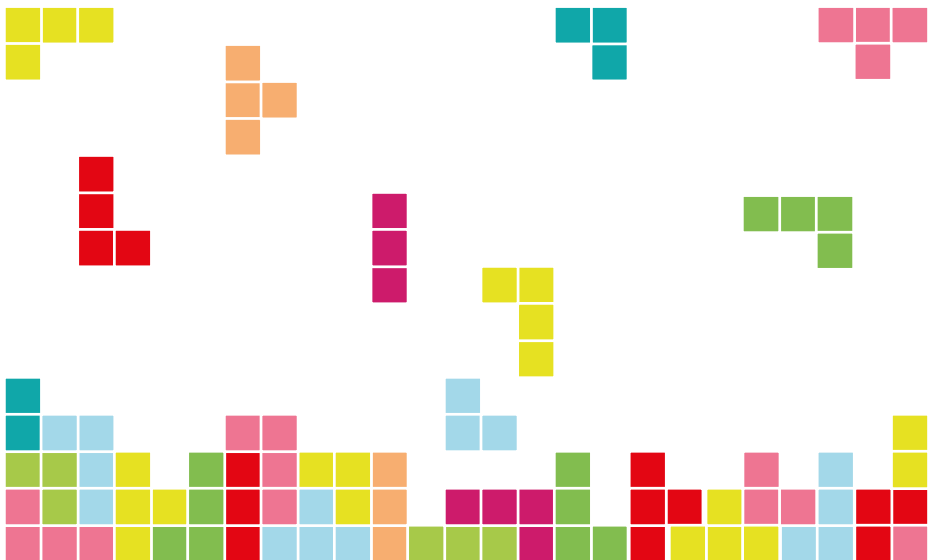

# The Transmedia Literacy Research Project

Transmedia Literacy starts from a different reading of the media reality of teens. Without rejecting the postulates of media literacy, it expands and complements them with other research questions and intervention proposals. Media literacy is interested in what the media are doing to young people, but Transmedia Literacy turns this around and asks: *What are young people doing with the media?* Instead of considering young people as consumers taken over by screens, they are considered

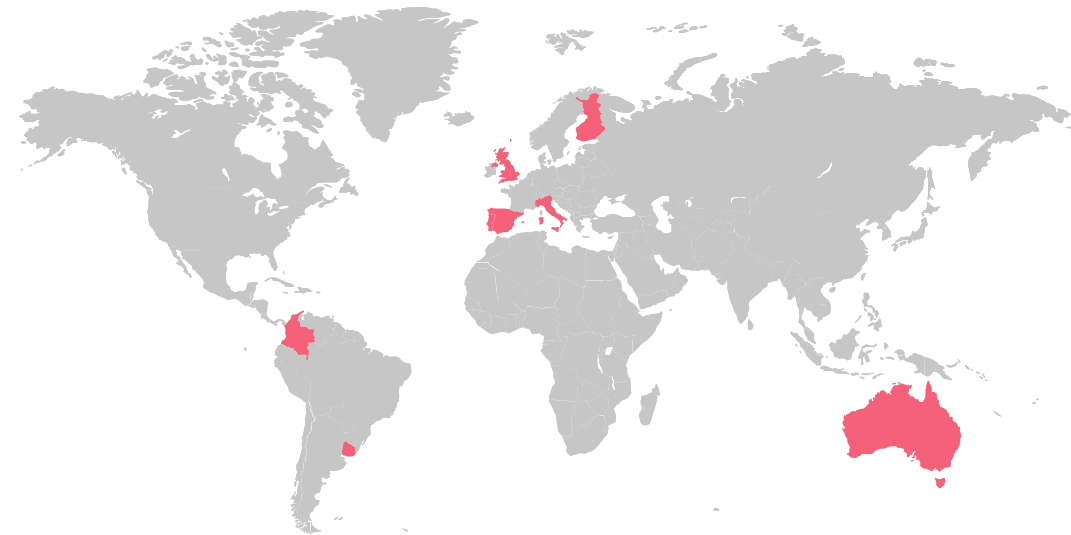
as potential *prosumers* (producers + consumers) able to generate and share media content of different types and levels of complexity.

Transmedia Literacy does not deny the need to educate young people to develop media skills, but rather it expands this framework to include research into the media activities that young people do outside educational institutions and proposes bringing this knowledge into the classroom.

- Integrating the data analysis and dissemination of outputs (2017-2018)

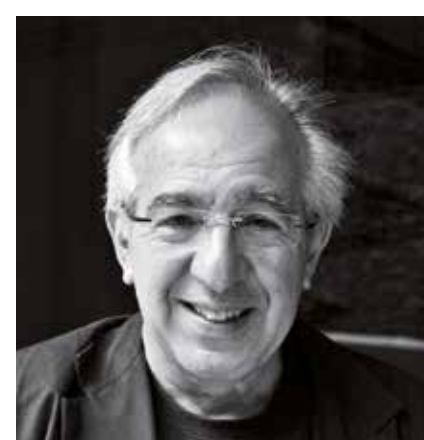
